

Anti-abortionist gets court date to answer for unpaid-fine charge

An anti-abortion activist who's appealing his convictions on tax-related charges will appear in court March 25 for a default hearing on an unpaid fine.

The hearing for David T. Little was scheduled for Friday in Fredericton provincial court but was set over because of his upcoming appeal, set to be heard Oct. 24.

Little, 62, formerly of the Fredericton area but now living in Alberton, P.E.I., was convicted in November for failing to file tax returns for the years 2000, 2001 and 2002.

Little believes that since his tax dollars go to fund abortions in hospitals, it constitutes a violation of his freedom of religion.

He has said he'll never file his tax returns and he'll never pay \$3,000 in fines imposed for Income Tax Act violations.

Little's appeal will be heard by the Court of Queen's Bench in Fredericton.
